The Instructor's Corner by Dave Jenkins

There are some shooters who are genetically wired to the 3 basic NRA rules and cannot fathom other versions, and there are some that prescribe to 2 rules or 11 rules. Let's just think outside those constructs for a bit. We ALL might just learn something.

There is a difference between 'Gun Safety Rules', 'Range Safety Rules'. And 'Real life CCW Safety Rules'. Although there are quite a few variations based on where you train or who you train with but in the bigger picture, they all have the same concept.

The three main NRA Gun Safety Rules are: **ALWAYS** keep the gun pointed in a safe direction. **ALWAYS** keep your finger off the trigger until you are ready to shoot. **ALWAYS** keep the gun unloaded until ready to use.

Here are the basic firearms safety rules from the NSSF:

- 1. Always Keep Firearm Pointed in a Safe direction
- 2. Treat All Guns as Though They are Loaded
- 3. Keep Your Finger Off the Trigger until You are Ready to shoot.
- 4 Always Be Sure of Your Target and What's Beyond It

In our classes we alter these slightly.

Treat all guns as if they are loaded. No exceptions.

Never point the gun at anything you are not willing to shoot or destroy.

Keep your finger off the trigger unless you are prepared to shoot.

Know your target and its surroundings.

Let's talk about the last rule in the three examples above, commonly referred to as "Rule #4" They all pretty much mean "Know your area, target, and backstop" Let's call this 'Surroundings"

Should Rule #4 become Rule #1? Should I know WHAT my target is, what the surroundings are, and where my bullet will stop BEFORE I decide to start pointing my handgun? You do know there is a good chance you will miss at least one shot, maybe more.

Referring to the other rules, in a self-defense situation, the best and safest direction might very well be the attacker, so I had better know my surroundings. If I am carrying my handgun – it WILL be loaded. I will not have my finger on my trigger unless I have a confirmed target. Those other rules will need to have been already worked out by the time I am on target/indexed on the threat.

Look at this another way: Why would you draw and point your handgun in random directions without knowing where it needs to be pointed? Again, should "Rule #4: knowing where your target is and where the bullets will stop" be more important than the others?

We all have seen videos of people shooting into a cornfield or stand of trees but no solid backstop. Wouldn't it be considered reckless or dangerous to shoot at a target on the range without knowing where your bullet will stop? Of course. What about in real life, deadly force encounters? You are responsible both morally and, in some cases, legally, for every shot fired. Hurting someone near or beyond your intended target is unacceptable, even if you did not mean for them to be hurt. You are still responsible for that. You own it.

Maybe 'Rule #4' SHOULD be moved to the front. On the range and on the street.

How about?

- 1. Always Be Sure of Your Target and What's Beyond It
- 2. Always Keep the Firearm Pointed in a Safe direction
- 3. Treat All Guns as Though They are Loaded
- 4. Keep Your Finger Off the Trigger until You are Ready to shoot.
