MEET THE MEMBER CHAIRMAN STEVE VERDI

One of the first things you'll notice about Steve Verdi is his direct approach to people and problems. You can attribute some of that style to his "downstate" roots, but most of it to his love of ORGC. He is a problem solver with a vision for ORGC that began in 2005 when he was looking for a rifle club. His first choice

didn't work out because he believed a club should be inclusive to all level shooters, patient with youth, have RO's with a sense of fairness not favoritism and actively involve members.

While Steve's godson, Scotty Junior, was in Rochester attending RIT in 2006, they joined ORGC to have something to do. One afternoon they went to use the recently opened rifle range, but couldn't because two elderly gents, who happened to be the club chair and president, were in the trap house. "How long will you be?" Steve asked. "It depends on if we have two guys loading this or four," the Chairman answered. Steve and his godson jumped right in. Scotty would later say, "I can see you running this place."

Steve's range orientation official, Roger Finger, became the mentor who encouraged him to pursue the challenges presented by an old 1950's trap club, embedded with traditions and practices that worked at one time, but needed updating. Steve, Roger and a few others pooled \$1,000 of their own money to start the Range Fund. With Roger's support, Steve presented his first idea of a berm between the pistol and long ranges. The idea was approved and Steve left that meeting as the new Vice President.

At this point, Steve began to do more over the next few years. He started to build the club from a defunct and slowly dying organization while under the constant scrutiny and criticism of club 'elders.' Steve, owner of a custom construction company, took it upon himself to build the planter box in the front yard and hoist the club sign that had been lying flat in the yard for years. The club Chairman at the time asked why Steve didn't get permission to do that job. Steve replied, "When I become Chairman, I won't look a gift horse in the mouth."

It was several years and several tactical moves later that Steve finally became the Chairman. He read the bylaws, called out the ineffective, replaced the dead wood, and built up just about every part of the club as it operates today, from the physical improvements of the ranges and clubhouse, to the youth program and the passionate support for veterans through the annual Veterans Fundraiser events.

Vision backed by determination and trust in the people he enlists to serve as tireless volunteers who work as hard as he does to make it a success. His keen ability to see the potential of people assures he puts them where they will do the most good for the club. Decisions are driven from his assessment of need and always in the best interest of the club. Steve's wife, Rosalie, is amazingly supportive and understands his commitment to ORGC.

You've got to admire Steve's tenacity and loyalty. He could have easily walked away. Instead, his vision increased membership, packed a calendar with events, encouraged friendship, planned ongoing improvements, invited fresh faces to leadership roles, added inclusive activities, and assured solvency. "When I do a custom construction job, I do it for one household. The gun club is different. I'm doing this for everyone. I want ORGC to be unique; different from other clubs. I want ORGC to be the legacy I built for everyone to enjoy." A big thanks to Steve for pursuing the vision we all enjoy.

USPSA RANGE COM-MANDS FOR MATCHES AT ALL LEVELS

Following are the OFFICIAL USPSA Range Commands to be used by anyone who takes the lead as the stage RO and is holding the timer and 'running' a competitor.

The competitor steps into the shooting area:

- Make Ready
- ♦ Are You Ready?
- Standby....(for buzzer)
- ♦ (Start Signal) Timer

Commands to use when RO observes potential safety issues

Stop Finger Muzzle Squib

When the competitor indicates he/she has completed the course of fire:

- "IF You Are Finished, Unload and Show Clear "
- Pistol: "IF Clear, Hammer Down.....Holster"
- Revolver: "If Clear, Cylinder Closed....Holster"
- PCC: "If Clear, Hammer Down, Flag....Case"
- Range is CLEAR

(USPSA Rules 8.3 8..1-8.3.8)

Match Etiquette Intelligence

Ever wonder why some squads for USPSA and other matches fill so quickly, while others don't fill until the last minute? If you're an educator, you've heard of Gardner's Theory of Multiple Intelligences. I added another for this purpose: Match Etiquette Intelligence. Practiscore, allows you to select with whom you'd like to shoot ahead of time. Chances are you'll probably pick people you know are fun, know will challenge you and know will pitch in to move the match along. You also know who you want to avoid. This is true at every level match. Some competitors may as well be in a squad alone because they lack **match etiquette intelligence.** What are some of the traits?

Be On-Time and Organized

- Have your gear ready when you arrive at the stage.
- Reload and be ready to go again after you finish the course of fire.
- Inform the RO if you need to leave the stage for necessities.

Be in the Moment - Participate

- "Range is Clear" is the squad's call to action every competitor's responsibility and everyone should be ready to work.
- Exception is if you've just completed the COF and are reloading, or if you are the "On Deck" shooter.
- RO's **should** call out the jobs required to keep the stage flowing and unless it's your first rodeo, you should know what to do if they don't call it out: Tape targets after they've been scored, reset steel, pick up brass and magazines.
- But don't be too quick! Be mindful that many shooters WANT to see their hits. Hits talk.

What people don't realize is following the Scorekeeper and taping after a target is scored gives you an opportunity to 'see' the target set-up from a different perspective that may provide another shooting option. And it can be fun. I've been in a 'race to paste' with some of the best. Rob Leatham is big and quick with a tape gun, outrunning me plenty of times to get to a target. Jalise and Justine Williams will out-paste as well as they'll out-shoot just about anyone. And, unless you like procedural penalty points, don't be the person who appears to be working by picking up magazines but is using one as an instrument to 'walk the course' (USPSA 8.7.2) when he/she isn't the "On Deck" shooter. The ONLY person walking the stage at this point should be the "on deck" shooter.

Unsolicited "Advice" Doesn't Help

- A tactful, friendly approach is always the best. Or simply be quiet.
- For the obvious novices, how about "I see you are new. If I can help you, let me know."
- If she is a girl, it doesn't mean she doesn't know or needs fixing. She probably has an awesome coach on her squad. Unless she asks, Shhh!
- The Exception is SAFETY Violations out of the ROs view. Safety is everyone's business and if the friendly approach doesn't work, alert the ROs to help.

Don't Run When It's Done

- Club matches are produced and run by volunteers who appreciate the help of every person on a squad to breakdown and store equipment.
- Tearing down gives everyone a chance to decompress, talk and build relationships.
- Everyone knows the person who always runs off without helping, so bring work gloves and pitch in.

3-GUN NATION: A HIGH OCTANE COMPETITION

It's an exciting time at ORGC! We are the first and only official **3-Gun Nation** affiliated club in the state of New York! What does this mean for you? This means you as a shooter can join 3-Gun Nation and get your official national classification at local ORGC 3 gun events. ORGC will be holding larger scale 3 gun events that will contain special 3GN classifier stages. It is these classifier stages that will determine your national ranking. You will be able to directly compare your scores to the best shooters in the sport. Browse the rules and membership information at: http://3gunnation.com

What is 3-Gun?

3-Gun is best described as the "X Games" of the shooting sports. Fast paced action! The sport of 3-Gun requires three different guns — a pistol, a shotgun and a rifle. The course of fire is timed and you score points by shooting a varie-



ty of targets including paper targets, clay pigeons and steel. In 3-Gun, the course of competition and targets are at the discretion of the match director. That's right, each match director makes up the competition so each 3-Gun match you shoot will be unlike the one you shot before. There may be shoot or no-shoot targets, targets that must be knocked down, while others, like steel, for instance, may activate another target. The course is scored by how many targets you hit, the accuracy of the shot on certain targets (cardboard), deductions for various penalties and, of course, the time you take to complete the course.

Gearing up for 3-Gun...

Believe it or not, you do not have to break the bank to enter the sport of 3-Gun. Attend a match to see what it's all about, and you're likely to find more than a few willing to loan you their guns for the day to get you started. Typically, you would start with a modern sporting rifle (MSR) such as an AR-15, a shotgun (pump or semi-auto as you choose) and a handgun. You are going to want to select a shotgun of 20-gauge or larger, a rifle chambered for .223 or larger and a pistol of 9mm or larger. You'll also need spare magazines for your rifle and pistol, as well as a way to carry and easily access spare shotshells.



The Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP) is a national organization dedicated to training and educating U. S. citizens in responsible uses of firearms and air guns through gun safety training, marksmanship training and competitions.



CIVILIAN MARKSMANSHIP PROGRAM -A NEW SUMMER PASSTIME?



Do you have an M1 Garand, Mauser, Mosin Nagant, or

some other old war horse gathering dust in the gun safe? Dig it out, dust it off, and come join us for some fun. The club will begin hosting regular Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP) High Power Service Rifle matches throughout the shooting season. The 2019 match dates are: May 19, June 16, August 18, September 15, and October 20.

Eligible firearms are any vintage or modern military service rifle, semiauto or bolt action, in an "as-issued" configuration (M1 Garand, 1903 Springfield, Mauser, Mosin Nagant, SKS, Enfield, Swiss K31, A2 / M4 profile AR-15, etc.).

Iron sights only, with the exception of the AR-15's. CMP now allows an optical sight (reflective sights are considered optical sights) with a maximum power of 4.5X installed on the receiver. According to CMP rules, only commercially manufactured scopes that were produced with a maximum magnification of 4.5X and that have a maximum objective lens diameter of 34 mm may be used.

The matches will take place on the 200 yard range and consist of a standard 30 round course of fire:

- 10 round slow fire prone with a 10 minute time limit
- 10 round rapid fire prone with a 80 second time limit
- 10 round slow fire offhand (standing) with a 10 minute time limit

The basic requirements are:

- an eligible rifle
- 40 rounds of ammo (the club does have a limited supply of 30-06 M2 ball available for \$1/round)
- a sling (a cheap GI web sling works the best)
- an empty chamber indicator/flag (we will have extras available)
- shooting mat, piece of carpet, or something to lay on while shooting prone
- stripper clips, enblocs, spare magazine (for the rapid fire stage)
- pen or something else to write with

Nice to have but not absolutely necessary:

- target pasters
- spotting scope
- shooting jacket
- shooting glove

The match fee will be a very reasonable \$5. We will have a few mentors/coaches available to make sure that everybody is comfortable with the process and has a good time. Come on out and join us for the fun!
